New Registration Process for Kick-Off Seminars starting 15 January

On 15 January, at noon, our <u>TUM-GS Kick-Off Seminars</u> until April 2025 will be open for registration. This will also start a new registration process: Beginning in January, **you will have one week to apply for a spot** in the Kick-Off seminar of your choice, **from 15 January (noon) to 22 January (noon)**.

After 22 January, we will randomly select from the applications who will get a spot. This means we will no longer use a first-come, first-served system, i.e., it does not matter when you sign up during the week.

You can publish your research findings in Open Access at no personal cost and enjoy online access to 150,000 journals. For 2025, the University Library successfully extended many existing agreements and secured new ones, including Elsevier, Springer, Wiley, IEEE, ACS, Taylor & Francis, Sage, and Oxford University Press.
